Escape Room Revision in RS

5th Years were testing their wits and knowledge this week in a GCSE revision Escape Room session.

RS pupils were tasked with cracking seven different codes linked to seven topics in class on Christianity and Islam, topics covered structural and practical revision tasks in preparation for their GCSE exams in May.

World Earth Day Assembly

During this week's assembly for 1st and 2nd Year pupils, Rev Helen and 1st Year representatives from the school's eco committee talked about World Earth Day. They presented their findings on species extinction, highlighting the potential extinction of certain big cat species within the next 10-20 years. They also explained that a 'food print' measures the environmental impact of food production and discussed strategies to combat climate change and pledges in honour of World Earth Day.

The teams shared a video created by the eco-committee showcasing some of our School's efforts to reduce our environmental footprint and achieve net zero status by 2040.

4th Year Geology Trip

This week all of our 4th Year Geologists enjoyed beautiful weather for their fieldwork at Praa Sands and Godrevy. The day provided a perfect opportunity for pupils to see in the field what they have been learning in class all year, and all within an hour's drive from school.

At both locations pupils were also able to examine evidence for climatic change, from a peat deposit formed when sea levels were lower in the last 2000 years, to a raised beach deposit at Godrevy formed shortly after the Last Glacial Period.

Miss Hope and Mr Blackie were impressed by the engagement of all pupils and their willingness to take academic risks as they sought to develop their practical and observational skills.

Salt and Pepper Shakers

The Thursday afternoon DT club has been practising their woodwork skills by making beautiful salt and pepper shakers.

Pupils used a hardwood (sapele) and a softwood (pine) and laminated sawn pieces together to create blocks that were hollowed out through drilling. They were finished by shaping, sanding and oiling.

These Thursday after school sessions allow pupils to try new techniques and practise their skills whilst creating something beautiful and useful to use at home.

Mathematical Enrichment

Maths enrichment plays a crucial role in supporting the school curriculum, offering valuable opportunities for students to stretch their mathematical skills. Despite being optional, these enrichment activities are integrated into the school day whenever feasible.

This week, approximately one hundred 1st and 2nd Year students engaged in the Junior Maths Challenge, a segment of the UK Maths Challenge.

This external examination emphasises logical thinking and problem-solving skills.

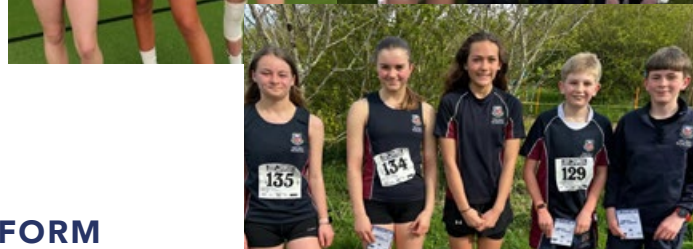

Observing Animal Behaviour

During the visit, the students had the opportunity to learn how to conduct unstructured observations, operationalise behavioural categories, and create coding systems. After ensuring the reliability of their observations, they delved into their main research tasks. Armed with time and event sampling techniques, they spent several hours collecting data and then analysed it using graphs.
