

19 JANUARY 2024: TRURO SCHOOL NEWS AND UPDATES



## Dear Parents and Carers,

At the end of another busy week, I write with my regular update on life at Truro School Prep.

Continuing our work on metacognition, I took advantage of Monday's assembly to use my own experiences to model how I have overcome some recent challenges. This included referring to my past experiences in similar situations and how I might apply my learning to the challenges currently at hand.

Furthermore, it allowed me to model the need for resilience and talk the children through my feelings and strategies when I am faced with a particularly tricky task. Taking the opportunity to model such experiences and behaviour is hugely beneficial to the children and it is undoubtedly helpful if you, as parents and carers, can talk to your children in this fashion when the opportunity allows. I do not doubt that such discussion is already part of your regular conversations with your children but, if this is not the case, perhaps you might wish to try it in the days and weeks ahead.

As for happenings here at school, there has been much action both in and out of the classroom. Highlights have included the Year 6 children honing their revision and examination skills (in advance of this weekend's Truro School entrance test and, of course, all future examinations), preparation for Youth Speaks and the Cornwall Music Festival, and the regular raft of sporting fixtures.

On this latter note, I take this opportunity to congratulate the Year 6 boys on their successful navigation through to the next round of the County Cup. Their match was a particularly close encounter and, with the score standing at two apiece after full-time, extra time ensued and yet still there was nothing between the sides. A thrilling penalty shootout followed and I am delighted to report that Truro School came out on top. Whilst this was a pleasing outcome, the most rewarding aspect by far, was the determination, camaraderie and good sportsmanship that was on display; both during the match and when consoling the opposition after the final penalty had been taken.

Of course, the major event of the week was the flurry of snow that fell early on Thursday morning. It was an absolute pleasure to be in the midst of so many excited children, parents and staff. Unfortunately, it disappeared all too quickly but at least we managed to enjoy the snow while it lasted and captured a few photographs along the way (please see [Page 5](#) of this Bulletin for more).

We would like to invite our pupils and their families to join in with this year's Big Garden Birdwatch. The UK's biggest citizen project, this is now also the world's largest wildlife survey.

The event takes place over the last weekend in January, from the 26th to the 28th of January 2024. To take part, you simply need to spend an hour watching the birds in your garden and record the birds that land.

It has been wonderful to see these efforts being put into practice and we have certainly enjoyed the ensuing responses from their engaged conversations.





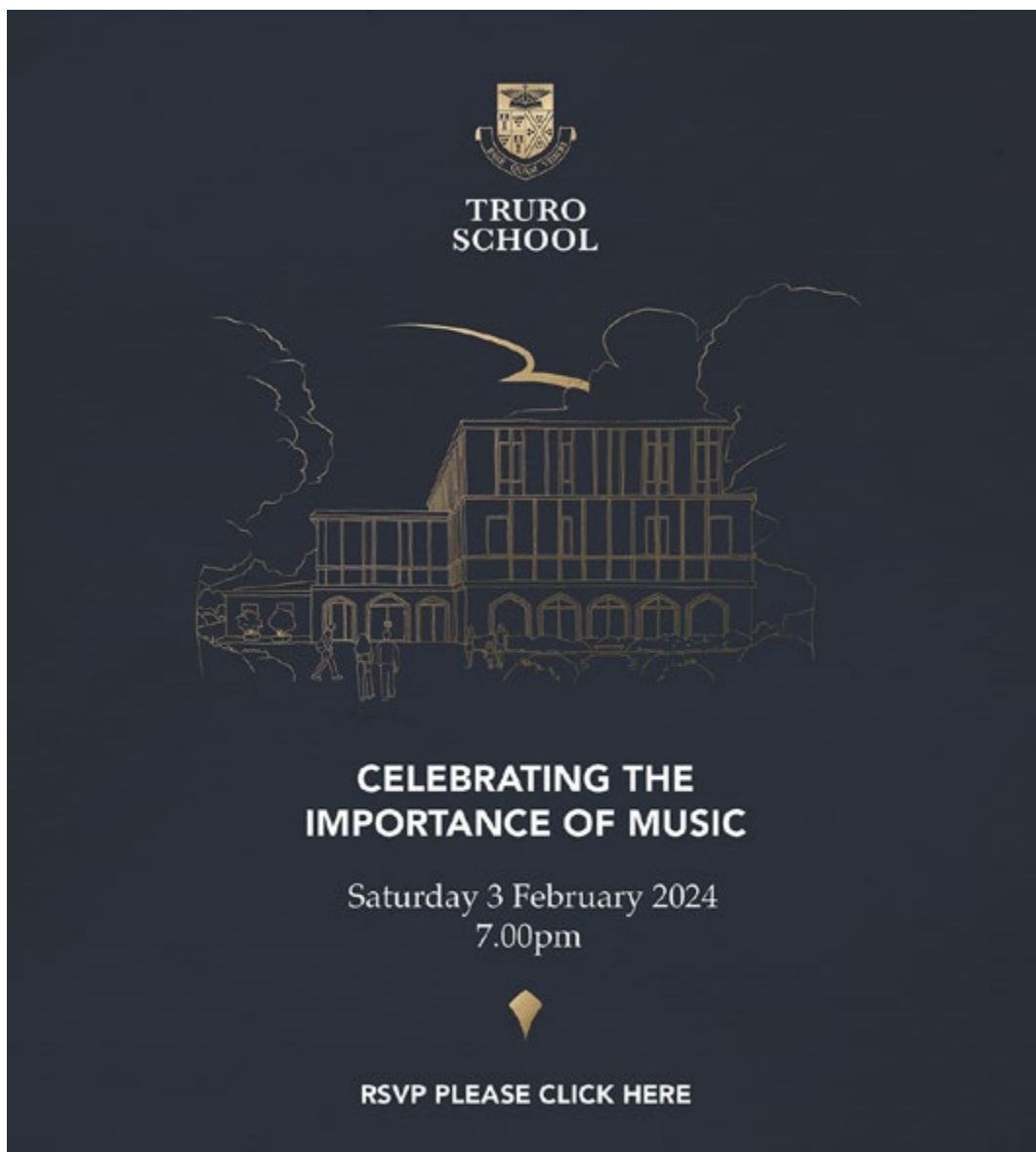
# An Invitation
