Dear Parents and Carers,

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Times Tables Rockstars Competition for Prep

In assembly on Wednesday 17 April, we launched the exciting 'Times Table Rockstars (TTRS) Turn Your Heat Map Dark Green,' competition.

This is a Prep School competition where children will aim to turn their heat maps dark green in 'Garage Mode' on TTRS. Here's an example of my TTRS heat map (clearly, I need to practice 3 x 5) ...

For every full times table that is complete, your child will receive 1 raffle ticket. For example, when all the 10 x tables turn dark green, a raffle ticket will be awarded. If your child manages to turn their whole grid dark green, they will receive 4 bonus tickets. Turning a heat map dark green means that your child can answer a particular times table question in less than a second, which is fantastic!

On Friday 10th May, there will be a grand prize draw in celebration assembly, where raffle tickets will be pulled from a hat and the winners will from each year group will receive prizes.

The best way to practice on TTRS is little and often, so if your child could practice on 'Garage Mode' for 5 – 10 minutes a day, it will have a massive impact on their times table fluency, confidence in maths, and all-round maths ability.

If your child already has some times tables that are fully dark green, then they can already win raffle tickets. The Maths team can look at children's individual heat maps, but please feel free to screen shot any progress your children have made in turning their heat maps dark green and send it to their Maths teacher!

Helping your child learn to read
